Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation except freehold land. Freehold land is stated at cost

Depreciation is charged to income and expenditure account on reducing balance method. The rate of depreciation charged during the period is given in Note. Depreciation on additions to fixed assets is charged from the month in which fixed assets is available for use while no depreciation is charged in the month of

Maintenance and normal repair are charged to income as and when incurred. Major renewals and improvements are capitalized. Gain or loss on disposal of fixed assets is recognized in current period's income.

The carrying amount of the trust's assets is reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exist the assets' recoverable amount is estimated and impairment losses are immediately recognized in the income and expenditure account.

4.2 Stock-in-trade

These are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost and net realizable value are determined under weighted average cost.

4.3 Trade and other payables

Liabilities for payable are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received, whether or not billed to the trust.

4.4 Revenue recognition

- Donations are recognized on receipt basis
- Admission fee and courses fee recognized on receipt basis







4.5 Cash and cash equivalent

Cash in hand and bank are carried at fair value. For the purpose of cash flow statement, cash and cash convivalent consist of cash in hand and at bank.
